Solicitor apprentices

Solicitor Apprentices at Moore Barlow are offered on-the-job training working alongside legal professionals.

The 6-year course culminates in qualification as a Solicitor. Apprenticeship training takes place in a number of teams so that Solicitor Apprentices gain experience in different areas of law. The placements in each team will depend on the business needs of the teams but apprentices will be exposed to a variety of legal areas so that they gain a broad experience.

Studying while working in the legal profession, our Solicitor Apprentices gain a law degree as they progress. They study all the modules which are traditionally studied at university and their academic and competency training is provided via the University of Law. The course includes preparation for the Solicitors' Qualifying Exam parts 1 and 2 which our Solicitor Apprentices must take and pass in order to qualify as Solicitors. The course is delivered by way of blended learning which means that modules are studied in a variety of ways including online, face-to-face, on-the-job as well as traditional

reading and research. Assessments, coursework and dissertations are all part of the course.

Although they gain a degree in law, Solicitor Apprentices pay no tuition fees. While they learn they earn a salary which is above the recommended rate for apprentices and which increases as the apprenticeship progresses.

When considering candidates for Solicitor Apprentices we look for 3 good 'A' Levels, preferably A, A, B or better. However we are keen to find people who fit

in with our culture and have other skills to offer. We will want to see an enthusiasm for a career in law, an eagerness for new challenges, a 'can-do' attitude and some commercial awareness. Candidates will need to be well-organised and have good time-management skills.
